

Theft from Vehicle Prevention

- Park in busy, well-lighted areas. Avoid having your car concealed by larger vehicles, fences, or foliage.
- Do not leave valuables in the vehicle or in plain view: (GPS devices, lap tops, PDA's, cell phones, MP3's, wallets, purses)
- Do not move valuable items to the trunk while in public view.
- Install an audible alarm system and a visible anti-theft device.
- Do not keep a spare set of keys hidden in or around the vehicle.
- If you see something suspicious around you, move to another area to park your vehicle.
- Double check to make sure your car doors are locked.
- Make sure your vehicle's windows are completely closed.
- Remove garage door openers, key cards, and house or work keys from the car so that a prowler cannot gain access to your home.
- If possible, store your car in a closed and locked garage. If your car is parked in a carport or near your house, leave your exterior lights on throughout the night. Consider replacing the light fixture closest to your car with a motion detector unit.
- Consider installing a security system with video surveillance capabilities at your home.
